The McHenry Township Fire Protection District is a 24 hours a day, 7 days a week operation responding from five stations to cover the 56 square miles. Each station is staffed by part-time personnel – trained as firefighters, paramedics and EMT's – that protect the approximately 65,000 residents.







## MTFPD Chaplains Offer Comfort, Support

The MTFPD Chaplains provide spiritual care, personal counseling and tend to the emotional needs of firefighters, department staff and the residents as they are living through an unfolding tragic event. A fire chaplain's goal is to aid, comfort and help during times of crisis and high anxiety. Fire Chaplains, while bound in religious tradition, can also serve as non-denominational and nonsectarian in their chaplaincy.

### 2018 Highlights

- Continue to be fiscally responsible by operating with 148 Part-Time Firefighters/Paramedics/EMT's
  - 32 Officers, 116 Firefighters
- Hired 26 New Part-Time Firefighters
- Strategic Plan Approved with Goals for One, Three and Five Years
- Tornado Sirens and Intergovernmental Agreements Five sirens were installed in 2018 throughout MTFPD in cooperation with McHenry Township, Nunda Township, Illinois Department of Natural Resources, Village of Holiday Hills, Village of Johnsburg and Village of Lakemoor.
- Interior Remodel of Station 1 First remodel since the station opened 30 years ago including training room, day room and administrative offices.
- Refurbished Engine 1246 Purchased in 1997, Engine 1246 was refurbished and serves as a reserve eliminating the need to purchase a new engine.
- New Ambulance Delivered Seven ambulances total, five frontline and two in reserve.



### More 2018 Highlights

- Station Alerting Faster more efficient dispatch improving apparatus response time
- Community/School Active Shooter Drill Working with McHenry Police Department and District 156, held a mass casualty drill at East Campus including student evacuation and multiple trauma casualties
- King Vision Intubation System New technology implemented to allow paramedics to visualize patient airway and vocal chords to improve advanced airway placement; successfully used the King Vision System six times in 2018, the most in our EMS system.
- MTFPD transported more patients to the hospital than any other fire department in our EMS system
- Awarded the Mission Lifeline Gold EMS Award from the American Red Cross

### 2018 Statistics

### 5,847 Emergency Calls in 2018

- 95 calls were related to fires
- 17 were structure fires

### 4,583 were Medical Service Calls

- 2,242 were advanced life support for critical patients
- 1,248 were basic life support for non life-threatening injuries
- Miscellaneous calls included activated fire alarms, downed power lines, activated CO2 detectors, car accidents, lift assists, odor investigations, water rescues and others.




# Incident Occurrence

### In 2018

An important activity in our emergency response planning is analyzing where incidents occur. To accomplish this task, historical incident data is tracked and plotted onto a map in one square mile increments. This information, in conjunction with other risk-assessment data, is used to identify staffing and equipment requirements as well as the effectiveness of current and planned fire station locations.











### Number of Calls by Year 2008 to 2018

#### Smoke Alarms In The Home

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom.
- Test alarms once a month and replace batteries every six months.
- Install on the ceiling or high on a wall
- Replace smoke alarms when they are 10 years old.

#### Carbon Monoxide Safety

- CO alarms should be installed in a central location outside bedrooms and on every level of the home.
- If the audible trouble signal sounds, check for low batteries and replace. If it still sounds, call the fire department.
- If the CO alarm sounds, immediately move to a fresh air location, call for help and stay outside until emergency personnel declare it safe to re-enter.
