

It is my pleasure to present the 2023 Annual Report for the McHenry Township Fire Protection District. For the past 84 years our department has taken pride in providing a high level of professional and compassionate service to the communities that we serve.

This past year we continued our transition to a combination fire department that employs both professional full-time and professional part-time personnel. The successful progression of this transformation, among other achievements, stands as a testament to the dedication and commitment of our members.

The McHenry Township Fire Protection District, in 2023, answered a record 7,596 calls for service. This rate of response situates the department as one of

the most active fire protection districts in the state of Illinois. The professional force, comprised of Firefighters, Paramedics, EMT's, and Officers, includes a blend of experienced members and recent additions to the team.

The year 2023 was marked by several significant accomplishments. Some of these include:


- Maintaining fiscal responsibility by operating as a combination fire department, employing both fulltime and part-time professional Firefighters, EMT's, Paramedics, and Officers.
- The ongoing evaluation of our service delivery model to ensure effective and cost-efficient service to their communities.
- Hosting the annual Awards Night, where department members were honored for a combined total of over 345 years of service to the District.
- Completing the remodeling of Fire Station 2 in Johnsburg.
- Conducting comprehensive testing for full-time Firefighter, Lieutenant, and Battalion Chief positions.
- Hiring 13 full-time and 7 part-time Firefighters and a new Public Education Coordinator.

2023 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Continued to be fiscally responsible by operating as a combination fire department consisting of professional full-time and part-time Firefighters, EMT's, Paramedics, and Officers.
- Held annual Awards Night recognizing department members for a combined total of over 345 years of service to the District.
- Completed the remodeling of Fire Station 2 in Johnsburg.
- Replaced the overhead doors at Fire Station 1 in McHenry.
- Installed a tornado siren in Bull Valley. This expands the fire district's tornado siren program to 11 sirens.
- Began the implementation of a comprehensive Community Risk Reduction program.
- Hired 13 full-time and 7 part-time Firefighters and a new Public Education Coordinator.
- Expanded our efforts with School District 156 and McHenry County College to interact with students pursuing a career in the fire service or emergency medical services.
- Conducted a comprehensive testing process for full-time Firefighter, Lieutenant and Battalion Chief.
- Further implemented the professional development program with an emphasis on preparing individuals to serve as Acting Company Officers and Acting Battalion Chiefs.
- Continued the scheduled replacement of Firefighter personal protective equipment.
- Purchased six Stryker Power-Pro Cots for our ambulances.
- Installed a new records storage system.












SIGNIFICANT PROJECTS FOR 2024

- Development and implementation of a new comprehensive 5 year Strategic Plan.
- Ongoing evaluation of District operations, staffing, and service delivery model to ensure effective and cost efficient service to our communities.
- Continued evaluation and planning for a future Fire Station 6.
- Testing and hiring of additional full-time and part-time personnel.
- Establishment of a new 4 year pay plan for District employees.
- Expansion of our public education and Community Risk Reduction programs including a pilot rural address/driveway marking program.
- Development of a new fire engine specification.
- Delivery of two new ambulances and a new Battalion Chief/Command vehicle.
- Replacement of the parking lot and pavement at Fire Station 2 in Johnsburg.
- Purchase of new cardiac monitors for our ambulances.
- Ongoing pursuit of grant opportunities.
