



MESSAGE FROM THE FIRE CHIEF



It is my pleasure to present the 2022 Annual Report for the McHenry Township Fire Protection District. Our department prides itself on providing a high level of professional and compassionate service to the communities that we serve.

In 2022, due to the continued growth in the district and the increasing call volume, we continued our transition to a combination fire department that employs both professional full-time and professional part-time personnel. The ongoing accomplishment of this process as well as the many other accomplishments identified in this report is a direct reflection of the intense dedication and commitment that our members have for the communities that we serve.

In 2022, the McHenry Township Fire Protection District responded to 7,507 calls for service, a 9.21% increase over 2021 and making MTFPD one of the busiest in the State of Illinois. Again, this relied on a professional force of Firefighters, Paramedics, EMT's and Officers,

representing a mix of seasoned, well experienced members as well as several newer members that have been added to our staff.

Some of our key accomplishments during 2022 that are worthy of special mention include:

- Continuing to be fiscally responsible by operating as a combination fire department consisting of professional full-time and part-time Firefighters, EMT's, Paramedics and Officers.
- Ongoing evaluation of our service delivery model to ensure effective and cost efficient service to our communities.
- Approval of the hiring of additional full-time Lieutenants and full-time Firefighter/Paramedics.
- Expanded efforts to recruit and hire part-time Firefighters.
- Replacement of apparatus and equipment as part of the District's capital improvement and vehicle replacement plan.

I am thankful to our Board of Trustees who continue to provide guidance, vision, and support the operation of the fire district while remaining fiscally responsible to the taxpayers.

I am honored to serve as your Fire Chief and to present the following organizational information including 2022 statistics and accomplishments.





2022 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Established separate civilian Board of Fire Commissioners.
- Continued to be fiscally responsible by operating as a combination fire department consisting of professional full-time and part-time Firefighters, EMT's, Paramedics and Officers.
- Held annual Awards Night recognizing department members for a combined total of over 300 years of service to the District.
- Hired 24 full-time Firefighters and 2 additional full-time Lieutenants.
- Increased part-time Firefighter recruitment efforts.
- Received grant of \$361,000 from McHenry County for the purchase of an additional ambulance.
- Established partnership with McHenry County Sheriff's Office for their new social worker program.
- Replaced 21 sets of firefighter personal protective equipment.
- Replaced the overhead and passage doors at Fire Stations 2 & 3.
- Took delivery of 3 replacement ambulances.
- Placed in service a new Brush Truck/Snow Plow.
- Placed in service a new rescue boat.
- Completed trial evaluation of a Paramedic Response Vehicle.
- Established additional committees to work on specific project areas.
- Purchased new particulate blocking protective hoods as part of the department's Cancer Prevention Program.
- Established a formal Acting Officer training program.
- Completed certification training for several new Firefighters, EMT's and Paramedics.






