






Our Mission Statement

The McHenry Township Fire Protection District is dedicated to providing the highest level of fire and rescue services to the communities served, through the commitment, preparedness, continuing education and training of its most valuable assets, its members, who work to assure the safety of the District's citizens on a daily basis.

Our Fire Stations

The McHenry Township Fire Protection District is a 24 hour a day, 7 days a week operation, responding from five stations to cover the district's 56 square miles. Each station is staffed by a combination of part-time and full-time personnel – trained as Firefighters, Paramedics and EMT's – that protect the approximately 65,000 residents.

In 2020, the McHenry Township Fire Protection District continued to respond to a wide variety of emergency calls, including those related to the COVID-19 pandemic. 





Staffed 24/7 with 3 Person Jump Company Engine 1245, Ambulance 1255 and Brush 1265 Responded to 372 calls within Station 5 response area in 2020



2020 Statistics



5,841 Emergency Calls in 2020

- 103 fire related calls
- 24 structure fire calls

4,378 EMS Related Calls

4,717 Patients Treated

- 2,266 critical patients treated for advanced life support
- 1,160 non-life threatening patients treated for basic life support
- 1,291 patients were not transported
- Miscellaneous calls included 1,360 calls for activated fire alarms, downed power lines, activated CO detectors, lift assists, odor investigations, water rescues and others.






By the Numbers

Fire Prevention and Safety



Smoke Detector Program

The program distributes fire safety education materials and 10-year sealed battery smoke alarms to fire departments in the state of Illinois. The fire departments then deliver the education while installing smoke alarms in at-risk homes within their communities.

Knox Box Loaner Program

Residential Knox Boxes are secured key boxes designed to provide responding firefighters and paramedics immediate access to entry keys for a residence. The residential Knox Boxes are made of heavy duty steel and are installed over the top of a resident's entry door. The MTFPD has the only key to open the Knox Box to retrieve the entry key.



Benefits

- The Knox Box system allows Firefighters and Paramedics to gain access to your home without waiting for a key holder to arrive and without forcing/breaking a door or window to gain access.
- The MTFPD Residential Knox Box Loaner Program is available to all residents within the MTFPD who anticipate frequent medical calls and may be unable to answer the door.

Terms

• The program has been designed for short-term use of approximately 6 months or less. The Knox Box remains the property of the MTFPD and shall be returned when the Knox Box is no longer needed. If a medical condition or situation is determined to be long term, lasting more than 6 months, then a Residential Knox Box may be purchased from the Knox Company through the Knox Box site, www.knoxbox.com.


- Expanded efforts to recruit new part-time Firefighter/Paramedic/EMT's


